The main focus these past two months involved planning, coordinating, and recognizing Veterans Day events. 89 Veterans in Senior Care and Assisted Living (Guardian Angels 5 Campuses, Bee Hive 1 Campus, Wellstead 2 Campuses, and Centra Care 1 Campus) recognized with a Veteran Lapel Pin, personal, Note of Appreciation by the Post 112 Auxiliary, a Certificate of Military Service Appreciation, a Personal Hand Salute, and two Campuses had a Post 112 Honor Guard with the Colors presented. There were 14 Veterans Day Honor Guard representations, including full ceremonies at five schools, a Veterans Community Support Agency, and at Post events that were conducted over a four-day period. Thank you and well-done Honor Guard and Auxiliary!! 14 Veterans Day public Invocations and Benedictions were given.

Continuing weekly and monthly vet visits and Sunday Worship services at the Wellstead Assisted Living Centers. Continuing weekly and monthly vet visits to five local Guardian Angels Campuses. Boys and Girls State Programs

Boys and Girls State Programs sponsored by the American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary are among the most respected and selective educational programs of government instruction for U.S. high school students. These participatory programs in which students become part of the operation of local, county and state government. They learn about the political process by electing officials for all levels of government and actively running a mock government. Some of the activities included are legislative sessions, court proceedings, law-enforcement presentations, and recreational programs.

These week-long programs are funded by the Legion Post or Auxiliary and are held at area college campuses in June. Students who have completed their junior year of high school are eligible to attend. Now is the time to start discussions with children, grandchildren, and other young people with above average scholastic standing, leadership qualities, interest in government, high moral character, and a U.S. citizen. SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

We are in the midst of the Holidays, so it may seem an untimely subject, but all too soon there will be many young people graduating from high school. The American Legion and Auxiliary have many scholarships available to members, descendants of veterans and military personnel. March is the deadline month for most of these, so now is the time to start researching the options.

###The Auxiliary "Past Presidents Parley Health **Care Scholarship**" was established to assist needy and deserving students or adults to commence or further their education in any phase of the health care field including the entire medical, nursing and dental support fields such as registered nurses, nursing assistant, licensed practical nurse, X-ray or other technician, dieticians, physical or other therapist, dental hygienist or dental assistant, etc. The Scholarship is a one-year scholarship for \$1000.00. Applicant must be a member of an Auxiliary Unit in Minnesota for a minimum of three (3) years. Applications must be received by March 15, 2025. ###The Children of Warriors National Presidents Scholarship is \$5000 for descendants of veterans who served in the Armed Forces after December 7, 1941. Applicants must be in their senior year of high school, complete 50 hours of community service and apply online. Deadline is March 1 at 11:59 PM Eastern time.

###The Samsung American Legion Scholarship is for students in their junior or senior year of high school who attend an America Legion Boys State or American Legion Girls State program. Applicants must be direct descendants of a wartime U.S. military veteran. Contact Michele Smith (msmith9519@gmail or 763-300-6061) for information on Boys and Girls State Events. These are just three of the many scholarships available.
